


iVolume Catalina Work around:

1. Open the Music (formily iTunes) app in Catalina.
2. You now want to export your music library:
In the Music app go to the File/Library/Export Library...
(This will create the XML file that iVolume requires.)

Very Important:

Save this file (file name must be named "iTunes Music Library.xml")
Save file to:~/Music/iTunes **You will need to create the iTunes Folder.**



3. Open the newly created iTunes Music Library.xml file in Text Edit and go to the line:

"<key>Application Version</key><string>1.000XXX</string>"
change it to:

"<key>Application Version</key><string>12.9.5.5</string>"
Save change.

I suggest you duplicate this file (You will need the version info after the next export when you add music to your library).

You can now run iVolume as normal until you add music to your iTunes Library. After adding music you will need to export your library again and repeat this process.
